Mr. Wayne Brown called the meeting to order at 10:13 a.m.

Agenda Item 1 – Review of prior month’s minutes - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any comments or concerns in regards to the prior meeting minutes. There were no comments or concerns from any members.

Agenda Item 2 – Item 1634: Inspection Responsibility – Mr. Wayne Brown reopened the discussion on inspection responsibility. He will be meeting with Mr. Williams to continue reviewing the matrix and have it put together by the next month’s

Pole Loading Meeting. Item 1634 is tabled until the next Pole Loading meeting in which it will then be reviewed in order to close out this item.

Agenda Item 3 - Pole Loading Discussion (Standing Agenda Item) – Mr. Wayne Brown opened by inquiring if he had sent out the 2018 forecast to all the members. The members responded that he had not yet sent the 2018 forecast. Mr. Wayne Brown stated he will send it out to all the members today or tomorrow. He stated that the forecast may change due to high fire issues. Ms. Nix discussed that there was a recent decision issued at the commission in reference to high fire areas. The commission has a more distinct high fire map that is separated by Tier 1, Tier 2, & Tier 3. Ms. Nix continued stating that any of these pole that have already been identified with an infraction that fall into these tiers, may need to get replaced sooner than planned. Some poles may need to be replaced by September 2018 and the remaining poles by June 2019. This may increase the amount of work that Edison has for this year. Mr. Wayne Brown stated that some of those poles may be on the 2018 forecast list and the numbers received may change. Mr. Williams stated that it is mainly the Tier 2 and Tier 3 poles. He continued explaining that Tier 3 poles have 6 months in order to fix any problems identified and that by September 1, 2018 they cannot have any identified problems older than 8 months. Mr. Mathisen inquired if there was any discussion at Edison about rearranging the schedule of replacing poles that were scheduled for replacement prior to September 2018 that are in a Tier 1 and swapping them for poles in Tier 3. Ms. Nix stated that they are not looking to switch out any poles, but to inform other members that if they had a pole replacement scheduled in a year or two that it may get pushed up sooner. Mr. Mathisen stated that from the perspective of those attached the volume is going up and they have no control over the Edison schedules and how things are prioritized. He continued with stating that it is important making sure everyone is in compliance and their poles are safe, but that it is hard to get any work scheduled. Ms. Carmichael inquired if there is any way to identify high fire poles on a JPA so members know what has to be done right away. Mr. Wayne Brown will see if Edison can internally identify the high fire poles on JPAs.

Mr. Wayne Brown added to make sure everyone reminds their vendors that for any pole information to reach out to whomever they are contracted through.

Agenda Item 4 – Miscellaneous - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any miscellaneous items. There were none at this time.

Agenda Item 5 - Review of Action Items -

- Mr. Wayne Brown to send out the 2018 Forecast and reminds the members that there may be some poles from 2017 that went into 2018 and some of the poles from 2018 may go over into 2019 due to the identification of the high fire areas.
- Mr. Wayne Brown also added a reminder to all members to send their Pole Loading together with their JPAs.

The meeting adjourned at 10:23 a.m. until February 20, 2018.

Mr. Wayne Brown called the meeting to order at 2:01 p.m.

Agenda Item 1 – Review of prior month’s minutes - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any comments or concerns in regards to the prior meeting minutes. There were no comments or concerns from any members.

Agenda Item 2 – Item 1634: Inspection Responsibility – Mr. Wayne Brown reopened the discussion on inspection responsibility. Mr. Wayne Brown met with Mr. Williams to discuss the pole inspection replacement guidelines. Mr. Wayne Brown has to redo the matrix and when it is completed he will forward it to Ms. Pranata.

Agenda Item 3 - Pole Loading Discussion (Standing Agenda Item) – Mr. Wayne Brown opened that he has the 2018 forecast on his desktop and will send it to all the members. He also has the high fire poles list to send as well to all the members.

Agenda Item 4 – Item 1651: Each Utilities Requirement for Allowable Pole Loading (2/21/18) – Mr. Wayne Brown opened the discussion. Ms. Hernandez stated that they are getting denials on JPAs because their pole loading was above the allowable loading threshold. Ms. Hernandez stated that they are getting denials by the cities and would like to know in advance because they think they are ok to go at 80%. However, due to the denial, they need to go back out to the field to see if they can reroute or see if they have to item that, creating a lot of work. Ms. Hernandez wanted to see if Mr. Pranata could send out a request asking what the maximum pole utilization or minimum allowable capacity for safety factor is. Ms. Pranata asked if she should ask for maximum or minimum. Mr. Williams stated to ask for maximum loading percentage when someone is attaching to a pole.

Mr. Wayne Brown stated that SCE is required to send over pole loading and are getting requests to send one side or to send it two sided. Any way they send the pole loading the other members want the opposite. Ms. Ortiz inquired why they are sending paper copies instead of electronic. Ms. DeBarge asked how sending pole loading electronic is working for everyone. Mr. Williams stated that his guys are having to print out everything in order to mark it up because they do not have laptops to do digital mark up in field.

Agenda Item 5 – Miscellaneous - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any miscellaneous items. There were none at this time.

Agenda Item 6 - Review of Action Items -

Mr. Wayne Brown called the meeting to order at 12:46 p.m.

Agenda Item 1 – Review of prior month’s minutes - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any comments or concerns in regards to the prior meeting minutes. There were no comments or concerns from any members.

Agenda Item 2 – Item 1634: Inspection Responsibility – Mr. Wayne Brown reopened the discussion on inspection responsibility. Mr. Wayne Brown is redoing the matrix. The item is tabled for the next Pole Loading Meeting.

Agenda Item 3 - Pole Loading Discussion (Standing Agenda Item) – Mr. Wayne Brown opened that he sent the 2018 forecast and inquired if all the members received it. He is going to double check that it was sent to everyone. He also has the High Fire, Tier 3 poles list that he will confirm gets sent as well to all the members.

Agenda Item 4 – Item 1651: Each Utilities Requirement for Allowable Pole Loading (2/21/18) – Mr. Wayne Brown opened the discussion. Ms. Pranata stated that she created a packet with all the responses received so far and most of the replies were at 100% (see attached). Mr. Plaskey stated that Frontier will make sure to forward the requested information. Ms. Pranata stated that a couple of the members were also asking questions which she forwarded to Ms. Hernandez. Mr. Plaskey stated that Frontier is looking for a 5% leeway. Mr. Williams stated that as long as they are meeting the safety factors with the appropriate install and replacement. Ms. Hernandez stated that they sent JPAs that are over 95% and under 100%, but these JPAs were getting returned. Ms. Hernandez suggested that Ms. Pranata create a chart of the percentages. Ms. Hernandez stated that any pole loading 100% or above they do not send, and anything not responded to they assume it is 100%. Mr. Plaskey stated he will get back to Ms. Pranata within one week. Ms. Pranata will create a table in which she will copy and paste the member’s responses. Mr. Wayne Brown will bring this up at tomorrow’s Administrative Board Meeting.

Agenda Item 5 – Miscellaneous - Mr. Wayne Brown inquired if there were any miscellaneous items. There were none at this time.

Agenda Item 6 - Review of Action Items -

- Mr. Wayne Brown recapped that if members do not respond to the request for allowable pole loading they are to assume it is 100%. Anything that is 100% or more will not be sent. He will also bring this up at tomorrow’s Administrative Board Meeting. Mr. Plaskey inquired about a deadline to respond. Mr. Wayne Brown stated that the deadline for a response is May 1, 2018, and the members agreed to this date.
- Ms. Pranata is to create a table with the member’s pole loading percentage responses.

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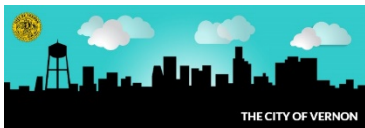

The PDF attachment shows the capacity for a cross arm allowance, however your e-mail asks for maximum pole loading. Our pole loading maximum for pole loading of new poles is a safety factor of 4.

Our pole loading maximum for pole loading of existing poles is a safety factor of 2.23.

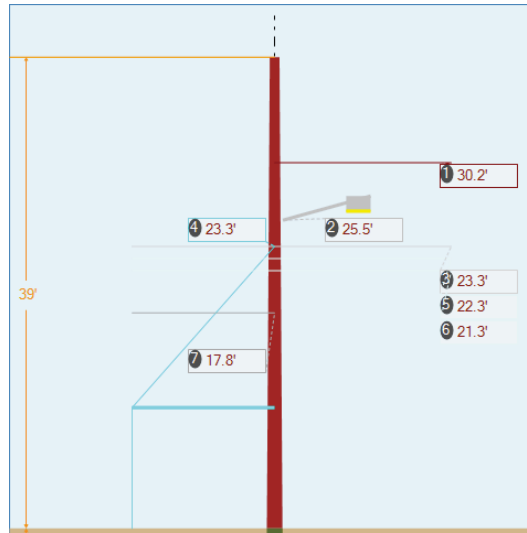
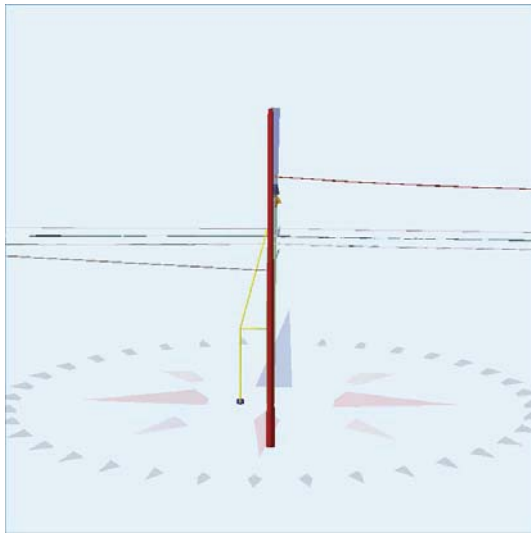

Mr. Mathisen requested to have the information forwarded to him. Mr. Brown stated he will forward the information to both Mr. Mathisen and Ms. Crawford. Mr. Mathisen will make sure that Terrance has the necessary information so he can attend. Mr. Brown stated that for Frontier, Albert was attending, but that he has been out for a couple of months. Mr. Plaskey stated he will circle back with both Albert and also Jerry Ruis who is the engineering manager for that area. Mr. Plaskey inquired if Mr. Brown had an updated list. Mr. Brown stated he has an analyst putting one together that should be completed soon which he can then forward it to Mr. Plaskey by the end of the week. Mr. Plaskey requested Mr. Brown also forward him the invitation for the next meeting. Mr. Brown stated he will forward this invitation to Mr. Plaskey.

Mr. Brown stated that he had not brought up at the prior months pole loading meeting, but at the Wednesday follow up the topic about SCE being charged on their permits on buddy poles still out in the field longer than 6 months. SCE’s position is that the fines should be on the other member if they were informed/notified. He stated that every time the city goes after 6 months, and if the buddy pole is still there, SCE is getting fined \$100 a pole. Mr. Plaskey inquired about which cities were doing this the most. Mr. Brown stated it is mainly by LA County and in the Caltrans districts. Mr. Mathisen inquired if Caltrans was for all districts. Mr. Brown stated that Caltrans is districts 7 and 8. Mr. Mathisen inquired if when Mr. Brown is saying the other members have been notified, if he means the final Form 48 was sent. Mr. Brown agreed that this was correct. Mr. Plaskey stated that Frontier is working on prioritizing their thousands of buddy poles by the biggest hitters, and that he will make sure that LA County and Caltrans districts 7 and 8 are made the priority. Mr. Brown stated that his list he is being set up by region. Mr. Plaskey stated that he will let his construction team know that LA County and Caltrans districts 7 and 8 are the biggest hitters. Mr. Brown stated that there are a few buddy poles joint with ATC and Crown Castle, but not a large volume of them. Mr. Williams asked if there were any with LADWP and Mr. Brown stated there is just a small amount, but no issues at this time.

Mr. Plaskey confirmed that Caltrans is fining \$100 for buddy poles out there longer than 6 months as well. Mr. Brown stated that this is correct and that Caltrans is basing this on the fact that the pole should be out in 6 months. Mr. Plaskey stated if they are stopping SCEs permits or if in lieu of holding the permit they fine the \$100.

Mr. Brown stated that are doing both, holding the permit and also not allowing SCE to get new permits due to the buddy poles. Mr. Brown has to go and explain SCEs process in order to see if they can get the required permit.

Agenda Item 4 – Miscellaneous - Mr. Brown inquired if there were any miscellaneous items.

- Mr. Serrato inquired if there is any way to know about deteriorated poles before applying to a JPA. Mr. Serrato stated that they are applying for JPAs, but after the 45th day they are learning that the pole is deteriorated, but they have set a motion to construct, then have to halt the process, and risk getting a lot of snags that way. Mr. Brown stated he will reach out to Ms. DeBarge to see if they can get that information. Ms. Mitwasi stated that Mr. Serrato could ask Matt Wisaski. Mr. Serrato is to reach out to Mr. Wisaski and Mr. Mathisen requested he bring that information back to the committee to share because it could also be useful to the other members.

Agenda Item 5 - Review of Action Items -

- Mr. Brown is to send an updated list of the buddy poles to AT&T and Frontier. For AT&T they will be broken down by HLA, HSO, and T.
