

How to Use the Multiple Pole Search

Use this page to perform a bulk pole search using either an uploaded Excel file or by selecting an owner code. This tool allows users to retrieve multiple pole records at once, including active and dead pole records.

Search Option 1: Search multiple poles by pole numbers listed in an Excel file.

Use this method when you have a list of pole numbers in an Excel (.xlsx) file.

To search using an Excel file:

1. Check the box “Does Excel contains Header?” if your Excel file includes a header row. Leave unchecked if there is no header.
2. Ensure the Excel file contains only pole numbers.
 - Do not include spaces, slashes, hyphens, or other special characters. Do not include additional data or extra columns, as this may affect search accuracy.
3. Click Choose File, then select your Excel file containing pole numbers.
4. Select Fields to Display
 - Under Fields, check the data fields you want included in the search results.
 - You may select All fields or choose individual fields such as Pole Number, Status, Base Owner, Location, Latitude, Height, etc.
 - Check the box “Show Active only?” if you want results limited to active pole records.
5. Click the Search button to retrieve results.

Search Option 2: Search poles by owner code

Use this option when you want to view pole records associated with a specific owner code.

To search by owner code:

1. Open the dropdown menu and select the desired Owner Code.
2. Select Fields to Display
 - Under Fields, check the data fields you want included in the search results.
 - You may select All fields or choose individual fields such as Pole Number, Status, Base Owner, Location, Latitude, Height, etc.
 - Check the box “Show Active only?” if you want results limited to active pole records.
3. Click the Search button to retrieve results.

Please note: For major pole owners; such as SCE, AT&T CA, FTR, and the City of Los Angeles; the search may fail due to the large number of pole records. If you are a major pole owner or if the search times out, please contact angela@scjpc.net

Export or Print

Once the search is complete, you may export the results to an Excel or CSV file, or print the results.



Tips for Best Results

- Excel file uploads should be in .xlsx format.
- When using the file upload method, ensure your pole numbers are in a single column and that there are no other data or additional columns.
- Selecting fewer fields improves search performance.
- Use **Show Active Only** to reduce large result sets when searching by owner code.
- If you are searching multiple poles using Option 1 by uploading an Excel file and the search times out, try splitting the number of poles into smaller batches. For example, search 5,000 or 10,000 poles at a time to prevent a timeout.
- If you only need a single pole and know the exact number, use the Quick Pole Search or Advanced Pole Search page instead for faster results.
